<u>Birkebeiner Nordic Ski Club Search and Rescue Report</u> for the Search Conducted on Mt Feathertop 31/08/09 and 01/09/09 from Philip Evans Birkebeiner S&R delegate and Contact.

Attention Frank Zgoznik,

Convenor BSAR Committee,

PLO, Merv Trease rang at 5:20am on Monday 31/08/09 requesting a S&R Group equipped with snow shoes to report to the Bright Police Station to search for a missing VIP walker.

After approximately 40 phone calls to home phones, mobiles and answering machines we had 7 volunteers ready to meet at the Mt Beauty Police Station where we would collect snow shoes and coordinate travel.

It took 3 phone calls to D24 to get the Mt Beauty Police Station open.

Monday 31/08/09.

At the Bright Police Station 3 other Bush S&R members (not Birkebeiner members) joined our group and were briefed on their tasks.

At 9:15am our group began to search the Bungalow Spur thoroughly to Federation Hut. They were to check for exit points, foot prints etc.

Monday afternoon: Line searches of the gullies surrounding Little Feathertop were conducted. Search Groups camped at Federation Hut on Monday night. Visibility had been extremely poor with

rain and snow falling. Tuesday 01/09/09

At first light Birkebeiner groups were joined by a Police S&R officer and a line search of the deep and very steep gullies near North West spur was undertaken.

At 10:00am our group observed helicopters hovering over a person waving a space blanket.

With the successful completion of the search the Birkebeiner groups then walked to MUMC Hut for lunch and then walked 3 hours down the North West Spur to the Great Alpine Road and then back to Bright.

The Birkebeiner S&R groups were not informed of any debriefing meetings and therefore did not attend any meetings post search.

Birkebeiner S&R members returned to Mt Beauty by 5:00pm and I informed PLO Merv Trease of their safe arrival.

General Comments

- Very hard walking. The MSR snowshoes were excellent in the soft snow and traversing was made easy.
- Police radio communications were excellent
- Many experienced searchers and organizers were in attendance

Our BNSC group was a very fit and strong group

Discussion Point

After talking with Doug Westerman who was the initial FO, I would recommend that the procedures for FO's be changed.

Suggestion:

When a larger group of BSAR members arrive at Search Headquarters with an experienced

FO.....there should be consultation with the country FO and the more experienced FO should then take charge.

BNSC members selected for National Teams are eligible to apply for club grants as outlined below. Please read the policy if you are eligible.

Grants to BNSC Members on National Ski Teams.

The guidelines for funding are listed below.

- 1. Applicants must have been a BNSC member for a minimum of three years. This condition could be waived in exceptional circumstances.
- 2. Applicants must be a member of a Ski and Snowboard Australia (SSA) Cross Country Ski Team.
- 3. **Written applications** must be received no later than 16/10/2009. This the FRIDAY before the October Committee meeting. (Proposed date 21st Oct.)
- 4. Applications must be accompanied by a financial statement that outlines other grants received by the applicant, outlines any sponsorship arrangements held by the applicant and outlines anticipated expenses for full participation in the Team . BNSC Grants will only be made if other levels of funding leaves a significant shortfall.
- 5. A maximum of \$ 3000 will be allocated for grants in any one year with a maximum of \$ 1000 to any one individual, regardless of the number of grants received.
- 6. These guidelines will be reviewed biannually by the committee or by a sub-committee appointed by the committee.
