Birkebeiner Awards Policy

Club Member Award

Called [Year] Birkie Award (e.g. 2020 Birkie Award)

This is awarded to a club member for *services provided that benefit*:

- 1. Club committee e.g. as a committee member or supporting it;
- 2. **Programs** e.g. junior coaching, junior camps, adult instruction, search & rescue;
- 3. Events e.g. social functions, ski de femme
- 4. All members e.g. clubhouse steward, skidoo maintenance
- 5. Kangaroo Hoppet

Selection Panel — Made up of the *President* and the *two previous winners*.

For 2021 this would be the 2018 & 2019 winners of the Ian Ryan Award i.e. Ann Bellingham & Blair Hume.

Nominations — members should have the option to be able to nominate a person(s) for the Award which the Selection Panel can consider. **Note** – nominations have to be in by the *May committee meeting*.

When awarded — Following the year in which it is won and at a social function during the season as happened for the Ian Ryan Award.

The Award itself — A framed certificate indicating in summary the member's achievements and contributions to the club. For example: '*For outstanding service and commitment to club programs & events'*.

Ongoing display in the Clubhouse — An honour board will be displayed in the Clubhouse. Each year the recipient's name is placed on it.

Note — previous *Ian Ryan Award* recipients will be eligible.

Life Membership

- 1. A notice should be placed in the first BNSC Bulletin of the year calling for nominations for Life Membership. At the discretion of the committee a nomination can be made at a later date.
- 2. A *sub-committee made up of three existing Life Members* will be given the task of receiving nominations (must have a seconder) and to make recommendations to the General Committee. This can be done via email or at a later meeting and a vote taken.

- 3. The *Life Membership Award* will take the form of a framed certificate indicating in summary the member's achievements and contributions to the club.
- 4. The *Life Membership* may be presented at the annual pre-season casserole dinner in June, the mid-season dinner in July, the end of season BBQ or at another function.
- 5. *Life Memberships* are awarded to honour a major contribution to the club over an extended period of time, with a maximum of two in any one year.

Certificates of Appreciation

- 1. A notice should be placed in the first BNSC Bulletin of the year calling for nominations for *Certificates of Appreciation*. At the discretion of the committee a nomination can be made at a later date
- 2. Nominations (must have a seconder) should be sent to the secretary and forwarded to the General Committee. This can be done via email or at a later meeting and a vote taken.
- 3. The *Certificate of Appreciation Award* will take the form of a framed certificate indicating in summary the **recipient's** achievements and contributions to the club.
- 4. The **Certificate of Appreciation** may be presented at the annual preseason casserole dinner in June, the mid-season dinner in July, the end of season BBQ or at another function.
- 5. There is no limit on the number of Certificates of Appreciation in any one year.
- 6. *Certificates of Appreciation* can be awarded to members or other supporters including volunteers and businesses e.g. sponsors, grant providers & community organisations.
