#### **Proposed Lakeside-ANARE Development** (Winter Activation)

Dear Birkebeiner members

As many of you will be aware, Falls Creek Resort has a plan to develop the ANARE hut (Lakeside precinct) as a day visitor centre/cafe. The original plan for the Lakeside-ANARE development was for 3-season ('green season') use only, for which Falls Creek Resort received a \$2.5M grant. This has now changed to all-year access to lakeside-ANARE, requiring winter clearing of the High Plains Road to the observation deck (near the dam wall).



A sub-committee of BNSC has developed a **position document** that considers the potential impacts of the proposed development on our club (and our clubhouse) as well as the broader cross country community. This document and the cover letter are now posted on our website.

It is likely that there are a variety of views within our club about the merits of the ANARE-Lakeside proposal. The committee fully respects this range of views and encourages you to become part of the conversation.

# **Race Reports**

### **Birkebeiner Classic**

Held Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> July in fine, mild weather conditions on softening snow at the Falls Creek cross country trail network.

The race gives skiers a chance to get back to the traditional striding technique called 'classic'. Skiers wax with 'grip' wax which enables them to climb the hills but also slide down the hill. Other skiers use non-wax skis (pattern-based, zeros, etc) that are designed to replicate the wax.

An excellent 5km course was planned and set by *Andrew Hall* and *Lucas*, the groomer, starting and finishing in the Nordic Bowl. Many other club members helped on the day to create an enjoyable but challenging course that everyone commented on favourably. It was a great team effort Birkies. Well done everyone.

Unfortunately, the dreaded COVID and many other respiratory illnesses meant a large number of DNS, particularly in the Master Classes. There were a total of 36 entries in the three distances – 10km, 5km and 2.5km and it was great to see some of our National Team athletes zipping around the course.

### Australian Open Championships

After a two-year break from running a high-powered event due to Covid, on the 30th/31st of July the Club ran the Open Championships on behalf of Snow Australia. Whilst there was a fair bit of 'remembering' how to do things the committee and volunteers were soon back into the swing of things and the weekend ran smoothly. A special shout out to *Stephanie Germancheva* who has taken on the role of Volunteer Coordinator this year.

Saturday was the Classic Sprint and the bluebird day and the fantastic course organised by *Andrew Walker* gave spectators an exciting view of the racing around the Nordic bowl. Kat Paul dominated the field in her favourite event whilst Lars Young Vik making his first appearance in Falls Creek racing won the Men's event.

Sunday began with some cloud cover which turned to snow during the Men's event, presenting much colder conditions to challenge athletes and volunteers. Alpine Timing's professional support over the weekend was fantastic and their new feature of lap times and progressive leader updates made the time trial event super exciting for spectators. *Kat Paul and Zana Evans* from NSW were swapping the lead throughout and ended up in a very tight finish with *Zana* taking the win by just 9 seconds. Third place went to *Phoebe Cridland*. In the Men's event, a blanket could be thrown across the first placings during the race but in the end, *Phil Bellingham* edged out *Seve de Campo* for the win by 16 seconds, with *Lars Young Vik* coming in third.

The shortest presentations ever were held in the bowl due to the snowstorm. Age class winners were recognised and will be provided with certificates shortly.

Running FIS accredited National Championships is quite a responsibility for our club and I am proud of the way the team headed by *Ewen Silvester* (Chief of Race) managed the weekend.

To help spread the load for the remaining race events we would be looking forward to seeing anyone who hasn't already volunteered at our upcoming races; the Rocky Valley Rush (21st of August) and the National Junior Championships (3rd/4th of September).
